The Imani Pearls Community Development Foundation (IPCDF) is offering educational scholarship opportunities to high school seniors who will attend and undergraduate college students currently enrolled at a Historically Black College or University (HBCU).

The applicant must have permanent residency or attend school in the Bronzeville, Douglas, Washington Park, Grand Boulevard, Oakland, Kenwood, Hyde Park or Englewood community.

Scholarship Award

IPCDF will make a one - time award of \$5,000 to each recipient. The award checks will be made payable to the scholarship recipients and will be awarded upon proof of enrollment in spring of 2019. **Application materials are due Friday, April 5, 2019.**
