



## 2020 HBCU Scholarship

The Imani Pearls Community Development Foundation (IPCDF) is offering educational scholarship opportunities to high school seniors who will attend and undergraduate college students currently enrolled at a Historically Black College or University (HBCU).

The applicant must have permanent residency or attend school in the Bronzeville, Douglas, Englewood, Grand Boulevard, Hyde Park, Kenwood, Oakland, or Washington Park community.

### Scholarship Award

IPCDF will make a one-time award of \$5,000 to each recipient. The award checks will be made payable to the scholarship recipients and will be awarded upon proof of enrollment in summer of 2020. **As a result of COVID-19, IPCDF is extending our application materials acceptance date to Monday, June 1, 2020.**
